# 50/50 MEGA RAFFLE FUNDRAISER

You will be receiving raffle tickets for our environmental 50/50 Mega Raffle ticket fundraiser. In the past three years, the 50/50 Mega Raffle has helped to fund our Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) Stewardship Program and has made three winners very happy – Carol Kress won \$4,325 in 2020, Katrina Vandermark won \$3,620 in 2021 and Michael Hurd, took home \$2,985 last September. Thank you for making the effort to sell tickets and raise funds to pay for our invaluable lake steward, a program that has cost our association approximately \$8,000 per season and continues to go up annually. ## CENTENNIAL CAMP CELEBRATIONS

Our lake has a long, interesting history. While we have a handful of historic camps, the oldest camps are Camp Utley & Camp Idlewhile, which were both established in 1895. Camp Utley still operates without electricity! For more information, you can read some of White Lake's history on the AWLA website or in Barbara Spring's book White Lake 1798 to 2012.

This year, at least two camps are celebrating their 100th year - the Dewey Camp and Forest Lodge (there are certainly others who have reached this milestone as well, such as White Lake Lodges and Camp Edgewood - the former Friendly Girl Society).

#### **DEWEY CAMP by Susan Sickels**

In 1923, Chester and Helen Dewey built a cabin, so that their growing family would be able to summer at White Lake. Their two daughters, Helen and Priscilla, inherited and loved this land and cabin as their parents had. Today, Chester and Helen's grandchildren and great-grandchildren celebrate every moment they can spend at "Camp." This summer the extended family will gather in August to celebrate 100 years of swimming, boating, and playing at White Lake.

#### FOREST LODGE by Barbara Spring

100 years ago, the Hall brothers, Charlie (President of Oneida National Bank) and Raymond (President of Savings Bank of Utica) built the three stud and clapboard, balloon-style buildings of Forest Lodge – the Boathouse with the Lakehouse above, the Main Camp, and Hill House (consisting of garages and apartments). Thirty five years later, in December 1958, the Spring family bought the camp. For the last 64 years, the Springs have lovingly maintained Forest Lodge, appreciating its history.

#### **BOATING SAFETY REMINDER!**

We can have fun and be safe while boating! Please be familiar with and adhere to safe boating practices. White Lake is relatively small, especially with the amount of boat traffic that can occur on weekends and holidays; be courteous, respectful, and aware of fellow boaters. Parents, if your children are out on the lake, check in to make sure they are aware of and observe all boating safety regulations. AWLA & WLSA will once again be coordinating efforts to identify offenders of boating safety guidelines. Most of the "offenders" we approached last season curtailed their behavior once a gentle reminder was given. Small tweaks to our boating behavior can make all the difference. ### INVASIVE SPECIES BOAT INSPECTIONS

Inspection of boats and boat washing prior to launching on White Lake is **required by law** and extremely important to stop aquatic invasive species from entering our pristine waters. This includes your renters and guests! Thank you for adhering to these requirements. **LOVE YOUR LAKE? WASH YOUR BOAT!** 

We have hired stewards seasonally since 2016 and will continue this summer, with lake steward staff onsite weekends to keep White Lake invasive species free. In an effort to control rising costs of the steward boat inspection program, this year AWLA has opted to independently manage boat stewards.
